We only need one form/check per family (even if you have more than one boy registered with the Pack). Please also note that Pack 200's re-charter is totally separate from that of Troop/Crew 200. Our \$40/boy fee includes the Council, District, and Pack Fees and a Boy's Life Subscription.

In year's past, the Pack and scouts have re-chartered or renewed the membership in March. The Boy Scouts of America will be making a change in 2012. Re-charter will take in January each beginning in 2012. Since Pack 200 is rechartering for 10 months instead of 12 months in 2011, we will collect 10 months worth of dues.

Facts about re-charter and the Scouting Year:

- The Boy Scouts of America was incorporated on February 8, 1910, and was chartered by Congress in 1916.
- The Boy Scouts of America re-charter with the Congress each year, followed by the Councils re-chartering with the National Organization. Lastly, we re-charter with the Council, and this happens at the end of March. Our new charter will run through March 2011.
- To get all of our paperwork correct, we start work on this in February and have everything turned in before we re-charter with Council at the beginning of March!
